

Board Certified Coach (BCC) Continuing Education Requirements

Why is continuing education important to you as a coach?

- It helps you continually improve as a coach by keeping you informed of the latest coaching practices, skills, knowledge and thought leadership.
- Continuing to learn and grow is a key factor in feeling positive about one’s occupation and fulfilled professionally.

As a BCC, you are required to complete 70 **clock hours** of continuing education (CE) every five years to retain your certification. The following requirements apply:

- Four clock hours must deal with ethics in coaching;
- The remaining 66 hours must encompass any combination of the six BCC competency areas; and
- BCCs with an optional specialty designation must accumulate at least 10 clock hours in each specialty that they hold. (These hours also count toward the 70 total clock hours.)

What qualifies an activity as continuing education for purposes of maintaining my BCC?

You should be able to answer “yes” to each question below if an activity meets BCC continuing education requirements.

Is the activity geared toward coaching (e.g., is not counseling- or treatment-based)?		
Does the activity enhance my role as a coach?		
Am I able to interact with the instructor or facilitator during or after the session? <small>(Applies to college, seminar and self-study programs. See approved methods for additional information.)</small>		
Will the activity be completed during my current five-year certification period?		
Does the training provider/facilitator have formal education, expertise or credentialing in the relevant BCC core competencies?		

What activities do not qualify as continuing education?

- Consulting work
- Time spent working under or meeting with a supervisory or mentor coach
- Courses in personal self-improvement
- Trade shows
